## \*\*What to do to help your child with the common reactions to shots (usually for the first 24 hours):

<u>Medications</u>: Tylenol as needed (for fussiness or fever)every 4 hours

<u>Massage:</u> Massage the area gently where the injections were given (a warm bath helps as well)

<u>Move:</u> Move the extremity gently several times a day
